

Cook County Timbers

Timbers provide a skeletal-like frame, which supports an entire building/structure, including fence posts. Traditionally, timbers were driven face out, begged together, and then infilled. This produced a visible frame from the inside, out. Today, Timbers still provide great structural support with fewer, larger pieces of lumber, while also providing aesthetic and structural benefits. Vertical timbers are also known as posts, which support structures at corners or other major uprights. Horizontal timbers include sill beams, noggin-pieces, and wall plates. And sloping timbers provide trusses and braces. Timbers provide great structural support in few numbers!
